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




How many ways can you spot?




Quran: The example of those who spend their wealth in the cause of Allah is that of a grain that sprouts into seven ears, each bearing one hundred grains.

Children, say salam to Sis Raudhah.


She is a mosque volunteer.


VISITING RULES:

As Sis Raudhah knocks on the door, Fitri is seen tiptoeing and picking a toy car on the shoe cabinet outside a Zakat recipient's house.




Quran: O believers! Do not enter any house other than your own until you have asked for permission and greeted its occupants. This is best for you, so perhaps you will be mindful.

(Surah An Nur 24 :27)

Fitri! We promised Teacher Aishah to control ourselves from doing bad deeds!

Do not take that toy! You are stealing! Remember what Sis Raudhah told us?

'Be Strong, Be Good and Be Wise!'



Quran: O you who believe! Why do you say that which you do not do? It is most hateful to God that you should say that which you do not do. (Surah As Saf 61: 2 – 3)





Hadith: It was narrated from Abu Saeed Khudri that Abu Musa asked permission to enter upon 'Umar three times, and he did not give him permission, so he went away. 'Umar sent word to him saying: "Why did you go back?" He said: "I asked permission to enter three times, as the Messenger of Allah (p.b.u.h), enjoined upon us, then if we are given permission we should enter, otherwise we should go back." **(Sunan Ibn Majah 3706)**

At another house, the door was opened. Sis Raudhah and the children stood at the side of the door of Atok's house and greeted him.



Hadith: When the Messenger of Allah (pbuh) came to some people's door, he did not face it squarely, but faced the right or left corner, and said: Peace be upon you! peace be upon you! That was because there were no curtains on the doors of the house at that time.

(Sunan Abi Dawud 5186)

Oh no! That is a big pile of garbage bags!

Now I know where that smell is coming from.



Ana and Fitri, we should say good things only.
Let's help Atok to throw the garbage bags.

While Ana and Fitri are throwing the garbage bags, they start talking about Atok's house which is dirty and smelly.

Children, we should lower our gaze when we visit other people's house.





Let's not talk about other people. We should be grateful that we can keep our houses clean. Alhamdulillah!

Back in class, Teacher Aishah is asking the children about the 'Takbir Challenge'. She reminds them to share their videos with her.



Hadith: "The dearest phrases to Allah are four: SubhanAllah (Glory be to Allah), Alhamdulillah (Praise be to Allah), La ilaha illaAllah (There is no deity but Allah) and Allahu Akbar (Allah is Greater). There is no harm for you in which of them begin with (while remembering Allah).

(Sahih Muslim 2137a)

During the Hari Raya celebration, the children help serve the guests. Alhamdulillah, they have learnt many lessons on wisdom in Ramadhan. InsyaAllah, they will remember to always 'Be Strong, Be Good and Be Wise!'
